What is the Nostra Aetate Foundation?

The Nostra Aetate Foundation was established in 1990 under the auspices of the Dicastery for Interreligious Dialogue as a means of promoting and supporting dialogue between Catholics and believers of other religions in different countries around the world.

It is based on the teachings of the Catholic Church as found in the Declaration of the Second Vatican Council, *Nostra Aetate*, on relations with non-Christians (28 October 1965).

The Foundation offers study grants to qualified persons of other religions who have proven experience working in the area of interreligious dialogue.



Goals

Guidelines

The study grants are awarded to persons who have completed their university studies and have received their diploma. The individual must be recommended by either the Pontifical Representative in their home country, by a member of the Dicastery, or another authority of the Catholic Church.

The grant covers one semester of study (either fall or winter) and includes registration fees, tuition for the designated courses plus room and board. Travelling expenses are not included.

As part of the acceptance process, the applicant should demonstrate facility in the language of his/her proposed study.

Applications

Applications are reviewed by the Board of Governors twice a year.

The following information is required:

- Application form,
- recommendation letter,
- proof of university degree,
- medical attestation,
- copy of passport.
